A Client's Story

My Second Time Around



In 2018, my three children and I left Mississippi and moved back to Lima. I found a job and arranged for daycare but I had no car and no support system. We came to Samaritan House. It was at the shelter that I learned so much about myself; things I had never known. I learned my strengths!

I worked Monday through Friday at McDonalds. WOCAP approved me for a housing voucher but since I worked every day during the week and had no car, it took a while to find a place. We stayed at Samaritan House nearly the full ninety days.

About six months after leaving, I began to think that there were probably more opportunities in Mansfield, Ohio, so off we went. I worked two jobs there but soon decided it wasn't for me; I wasn't moving forward. I

wanted to be in a familiar place, to find work and to re-gain what the children and I had, a place of our own. We came back to Lima.

Once back, I tried staying with a friend. Unfortunately, it didn't work out the way I had hoped; the way I had planned. We came back to Samaritan House. Perhaps I had a different mindset this time because coming back helped me in every way possible! It made me realize that all I need is my kids and myself; that I can make it without a support system if I have to. I became aware of the fact that it all starts with me. I have to be motivated and be willing to put forth the effort it takes to get to where I need to be.

There is so much good I could say about this beautiful place, it has changed my perspective on life and on how I see the world. Living at the shelter has also had a powerful effect on my girls. They have structure, a routine and are on a schedule. They love it! Although they are very young, they follow my footprints. They know that together we can handle the struggle because it will get us to where we need to be.

A note from the Case Manager: Briana (not her real name) first came to the shelter last year. While she did what she needed to do in order to 'get by,' she required a lot of 'prodding.' The Briana we see now has all her ducks in a row. She actually needs very little time with me and is on a path toward realizing her goals. It is heartening to see her progress.

Blessed by His Timing

In 2018, we began planning a large project to replace flooring in much of the shelter. Due to the scale of the project it had to be broken into manageable phases for staff availability and to limit the disruption to the residents. We are always prayerful on how and when to best utilize the resources provided to us.

December is usually a very busy time of year at the shelter. Our population is generally high and we receive and process a large portion of our annual donations. If we were to plan a major renovation project, we would not pick December. But, as always, with God anything is possible!

Shortly before Christmas, we were approached by the Husky Volunteer Council. They had funds remaining for the year and wanted to know how they could help. Due to their generosity, both financially and logistically, combined with other donations, enough flooring to complete two phases of the project was purchased and installed with enough materials remaining for three more rooms. The number of residents staying with



us was unusually low for the time of year and everyone could be moved to the second floor to free up the third floor for the renovation. We would have been grateful to be able to complete these two phases by the end of 2019, let alone by the end of 2018! There were so many pieces that came together at just the right time to make this happen. It could not have happened by chance. Once again, Samaritan House was truly *Blessed by His Timing*.
